Alisa Pettitt is a Ph.D. Candidate in the Department of Geography and Geoinformation Science at George Mason University (GMU). She is also an SOI qualified archaeologist with over thirteen years of archaeological experience across fifteen states and abroad, currently working as a Fairfax County Archaeological Field Director. With Fairfax County, she has worked on numerous county properties, including Halifax Point Park, Salona Historic Site, Ellmore Farm, Colvin Run, Green Spring Gardens, Patriot Park North, Sully Historic Site, Ash Grove Historic Site, Lahey Lost Valley, Turner Farm, Sully Woodlands, Old Colchester Park and Preserve, and Riverbend.



Alisa is a Provost Award scholar and recipient of a National Science Foundation award. She has presented her research in extended realities (augmented, virtual and mixed realities (XR)) for archaeological site interpretation, preservation, and analysis at international, e.g., AAG, SAA, ICC, and regional conferences, e.g., ASV, MAAC, VAM, MAD-AAG, and NACIS. Alisa was also an invited speaker at Technische Universitat, Vienna, for Carto Talks. During early 2020, Alisa developed and operated an immersive virtual reality (IVR) application highlighting an archaeological site at Northern Virginia's Riverbend Park.
